Navigation Services	The navigation team provides information, assessment, and referrals to resources at Jefferson Center and in the community. Commercial Services	Commercial Services (CS) offers outpatient therapy to clients, primarily with private insurance. Interns will provide initial assessments, individual therapy, and group psychotherapy to clients of any age they are trained to support, from early childhood to older adults. Interns will have a caseload of clients for ongoing therapy to support during their training. Interns will be exposed to a variety of diagnoses, backgrounds, and presenting problems. Interns must work constructively with clients to reach agreed upon outcomes and coordinate care with internal and external providers. Hybrid position: minimum 1 day onsite required.	LCSW, LPC
Mountain Services	Mountain Outpatient interns will provide initial assessments, individual therapy as well as care coordination and case management for consumers living in the mountain areas. Interns will have a caseload of clients for ongoing therapy and be exposed to a variety of diagnoses, backgrounds, and presenting problems. Interns must work constructively with consumers to reach agreed upon outcomes and coordinate care with internal and external providers. Hybrid position: minimum 1 day onsite required.	LPC
FSOP	Family Services Outpatient (FSOP) clinical interns will provide individual and family psychotherapy, as well as care coordination and case management to clients aged 8-22 years old. There will also be opportunities to complete intake assessments and facilitate or co-facilitate groups. Interns will have a caseload of clients for ongoing therapy. You will be exposed to a variety of diagnoses, backgrounds, and presenting problems. Interns must work constructively with clients/caregivers to reach agreed upon outcomes and coordinate care with internal and external providers. Hybrid position: minimum 1 day onsite required.	LPC

TST	This position requires you have your own car (mileage reimbursement provided), and that you are available afternoons and some evenings to provide in-home services to clients and families. Applicants should be 2nd year students or have experience in the field. The TST team provides intensive family systems trauma treatment, with a particular focus in safety stabilization and regulation skills. We serve youth ages 4-21 and their families. TST clients must have a plausible trauma history and be at risk of hospitalization, placement out of the home, and/or legal system involvement. TST intervention requires work with both the child and their guardian. Services take place in the community, in homes, and occasionally in the office. Each case is typically seen twice a week by their therapist. TST interns will learn and be responsible for all aspects of care including intake, assessment, diagnosis, case management, and treatment provision. Training in the TST modality will be provided. Interns will be responsible for learning and utilizing the TST modality which will include weekly group consultation, case presentation to the TST team, and working closely with their individual supervisor. Many cases require strong communication between a clinician and other agencies, and many families are often engaged in multiple systems (school, court, human services, psychiatry, etc.). Interns will be assigned at least three TST cases for in-home services. Additional clients may be assigned via Family Services Outpatient or Family Services Intakes. Shadowing or co-facilitating opportunities may be available across other Center programs (youth groups, adult groups, crisis, etc.).	LPC
Family FlexCare	Jefferson Center's Family FlexCare Team operates off the main goal of moving clients through the phases of care as quickly as possible to help them reach the maintenance stage and stay there longer. From day one, clients are given access to a comprehensive set of wraparound services through a team of dedicated care providers. The team itself is a mental health one stop shop, comprised of a case manager, therapist, nurse, prescriber, and peer specialist, with support from an intake specialist. In its current format, clients have the opportunity to receive care from the comfort of their home through telehealth or in-person at one of our locations. This clinic serves Families and Youth ages 8-21, working through a client centered care approach to support and meet the needs of the client.	LPC
Older Adult Services Outpatient	Older Adult Services (OASP) is an outpatient counseling program serving adults 60 years and older. Services include individual and group counseling for older adults in addition to psychiatric/medication management services and light case management. Older Adult Services also offers groups on hoarding, grief/loss, self compassion, and opportunities to create your own. Through solution-focused counseling, OASP helps older adults regain confidence, increase their ability to cope with everyday changes, and assist with maintaining health and independence. Therapy work often incorporates managing co-morbid chronic health conditions. This internship provides diverse experiences with opportunities to work with other aging services providers, learn community resources, deliver presentations, and provide care management and clinical services. This placement offers a hybrid of in office and remote work.	LCSW

Early Childhood & Family Services	This intern position will be split between activities related to being an early childhood clinician and an early childhood mental health consultant. As a clinicians, interns are responsible for intakes to assess the needs of young children and their parents/caregivers. Interns provide evidence-based treatments (e.g., play therapy, Child Parent Psychotherapy) using a systemic approach for a variety of early childhood mental health disorders, and have the opportunity to participate in parenting education groups. As a consultant, interns will work with early childhood providers in public, private and in-home settings to help support caregivers to promote positive social emotional development in children. Consultation is considered prevention services so the work is with the adult in a child's life so that they understand and support a child or children in their care. Interns participate in team meetings and group supervision. Hybrid position: minimum 1 day onsite required.	LPC LCSW
School based	The School Based Services team provides therapy to students grades K-12 at their school during the school day. With a team of about 25 clinicians, the school-based team stretches elementary, middle, and high schools. We focus on helping students address their mental health challenges so they can participate fully in their educational, social, and family lives. As a school-based clinician, we operate similar to an outpatient therapist whose office is in the school. Unique to this team, however, we have an added community of collaborating with the counselors, teachers, and administrators to best serve our clients (also, we get to go to the fall break pep rally in the middle of the workday)! As an intern you will gain experience with the intake, assessment/diagnostic, and therapeutic process, while also learning about providing mental health support in a school system. Therapy with this population often focuses on helping students manage and process anxiety, depression, and trauma.	LPC
Ascent	This program is for youth and young adults who have experienced or continue to experience their first episode of psychosis. The goal of the program is to quickly stabilize and reduce symptoms through early intervention. The ascent program includes helping people go back to or stay in school, secure and maintain employment, live independently and form meaningful relationships. The program offers care and support services for up to three years, based on needs and preferences. We provide access to therapeutic and supportive services throughout the treatment time.	LCSW, LAC

Adult Residential Recovery	Our capacity is 15 clients providing exposure to a large variety of diagnoses. Daily staff consist of three milieu counselors (techs), one peer specialist, one nurse, one engagement specialist, two therapists, and an admissions coordinator/utilization manager in addition to clinical leadership. Often we serve more acute need clients that are new to treatment, veterans to treatment, and everything in between. Our population is most frequently clients that are looking to meet the earlier needs in Maslow's Heirarchy, seeking a brighter future in early recovery. An intern in this program will carry a caseload of no more than three clients and be responsible for meeting with them individually weekly as well as completing treatment plan updates, updating ASAMs, supporting with case management needs, and developing aftercare. Additionally, intern therapists are responsible for running one evidence-based group daily on material of their choice (established curriculum is available). An ideal intern for this placement is one that is interested in expanding their understanding of co-occurring diagnoses, invested in developing their traumainformed approach, is detail oriented and organized, is an out of the box thinker,	LPC
	and good at operating with significant autonomy in a very fast-paced environment. This placement is 100% on-site.	
Substance Use Outpatient	Our SUD outpatient team provides clients with individual therapy, group therapy and intensive outpatient group therapy to offer a full spectrum of services. We have 6 therapists, an intake clinican, and two case managers. We work closely with other JCMH teams to ensure collaboration of care and appropriate referrals. We complete intakes and assess for appropriate levels of care for co-occuring disorders. Our team is located throughout all outpatient JCMH locations and we also provide tele-health services. Hybrid position: minimum 1 day onsite required.	LPC LAC
Crossroads/Porchlight	The internship spans two different programs under the Intensive Family Services Division at the Center. Interns will provide clinical services for both the CrossRoads and PorchLight programs. The CrossRoads Team works primarily with adolescents ages 10-22 at-risk or involved in the juvenile justice system. These referrals most often come from families directly, the school district, the court system or juvenile assessment centers. This co-located program is in the Remington Building. Jefferson Center also partners with PorchLight, A Family Justice Center. Interns will work with clients across the lifespan who have experienced or witnessed domestic violence, child abuse, human trafficking, exploitation, and sexual assault. Interns will be responsible for initial clinical assessments on new referrals, providing individual and family treatment (inoffice and telehealth), providing professional updates and recommendations as well as leading groups. Mandatory group supervision and clinical consultation on Wednesdays from 11am-12:30pm. Hours are flexible; however, an intern will need to be available at least some evenings until 6pm M-F to accommodate families' schedules. Psych Testing	Under supervision of licensed psychologist provide psychological testing service to diverse clients with a broad range of presenting problems. Students will be trained on administration, scoring, interpreting, report writing, and feedback using standard cognitive tests and personality measures. For students trained in Rorschach opportunity to use in personality assessments may be available. Attend group supervision and trainings as required. Hybrid position with onsite testing required. Applicants must have completed assessment coursework.	LP
Solid Ground	Solid Ground Apartments is a Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program for people coming out of homelessness located in Lakewood, CO. Through our PSH program, we aim to provide long-term stability, wraparound services, and personalized support to help clients achieve housing stability and improve their quality of life. We are looking for an enthusiastic and motivated intern to assist our team. This internship offers hands-on experience in supportive housing services, client interaction, case management, therapy, and program administration. You will work closely with staff to help clients navigate housing-related issues and ensure they have access to the resources and support they need for long-term success. We can accommodate a first- or second-year internship, with a first-year internship focused on case management and a second-year internship focused on therapy. Crisis Walk in Center	The Emergency/Crisis Team provides crisis intervention services for the community 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Clinicians are trained in de-escalation techniques, crisis intervention, safety planning, and assessing the need for higher level of care. Anyone experiencing a behavioral health crisis is able to come to the Walk-In Crisis Center (WIC) at any time of day. The WIC is staffed with masters and doctoral level clinicians, a peer specialist, case manager, and registered nurses. This internship will focus on crisis counseling and intervention, crisis assessment for and preparation of mental health holds if needed, some intakes, care coordination, and outreach. Ideal interns are comfortable with brief clinical interactions and adaptable to dynamic and often changing working conditions. Clinicians are also available to provide mobile, community-based de-escalation for the purpose of addressing safety concerns while allowing clients to remain in the community and to prevent hospitalization. Services may be provided in-person or via telehealth. Interns are onsite for all internship hours. Days available for internship are Mondays, Tuesdays or Fridays.	LPC LCSW

New Vistas Crisis Stabilization Unit	New Vistas is a 24/7 crisis stabilization unit for kids aged 5 to 18 ½. We are currently the only adolescent CSU in the state, so we can receive our clients from anywhere in Colorado. In our program, children/adolescents stay on average 2-5 days to receive individual, family and group therapy to help them stabilize from their crisis. Clients come to us for a variety of reasons including suicidal ideation, homicidal ideation, NSSIB, distress from mental health symptoms and family defined crisis. Our program consists of milieu staff, therapists, nurses, a prescriber, and admission staff. There is no set caseload in our program, all therapists are responsible for providing short-term therapeutic treatment for our clients. Interns are responsible for running at least one group daily (established curriculum) and completing an individual /family /assessment/discharge session. This placement is great for interns who are looking for flexibility in hours including afternoon, evening up to 7pm, and weekend hours. Interns will get experience with using different modalities (e.g., CBT, ACT, DBT, play therapy), short-term treatment planning, diagnosing, safety planning, assessing for safety, documentation, discharge planning and collaborating with other providers. Individual supervision is provided with the option to engage in group supervision on Mondays and Thursdays. This position is fully inperson.	LCSW, LMFT
Psychology Externship	This placement is housed within the Psychology Doctoral Internship and receives supervision using a vertical supervision model. Students will receive weekly clinical supervision from psychology interns and didactic trainingsfrom a licensed psychologist. Student will provide individual and/or group therapy for clients across the lifespan using Evidence Based Practices with caseload of 10-15 clients. Student will also perform initial intakes for individuals seeking services through Jefferson Center. Student training on intakes focuses on developing diagnostic skills and risk assessment. This position is hybrid with minimum 1 day onsite required.	LP
