- Provides cash assistance to individuals who are **not** already receiving Supplemental Security Income (SSI). If someone is receiving SSI, they may still qualify for medical insurance (Medicaid) benefits through Aid to the Blind.
- Eligibility: Be aged 59 or younger, Be a resident of Denver County, Be born in the US, a naturalized citizen, or a legal alien, and Receive certification by an optometrist or ophthalmologist as meeting the legal definition of blindness and without work capacity, if applicable.
