- Students must be willing to make a three year commitment through 10th 12th grades.
 - Meet almost every Monday evening for three hours from September through May
 - Apply and attend a residential summer program
- Benefits
 - Weekly mentoring
 - Paid tuition for summer programs
 - 40-50 hours of SAT prep
 - o Individualized support applying to at least 6 colleges and 20 scholarships
- Eligibility
 - Student is in 9th grade with a 3.25 GPA or higher.
 - Student must maintain a 3.25 GPA or higher while enrolled in Minds Matter (10th-12th grade)
 - Student must qualify for free/reduced lunch
- How to Apply:
 - Complete an application online that consists of short and long essays
 - Have a teacher fill out an online recommendation
 - Have a counselor fill out an online recommendation
 - Have a parent or guardian fill out the parent/guardian application form
 - After submitting the application there will be a 30 minute interview
