 - Currently, we do not have contracts with Denver Health Managed Care Medicaid, CHP+ Medicaid, or private insurance companies.
 - We do accept private pay; the cost of a Sewall evaluation is \$3500.
- Evaluations are performed every Tuesday; the time your child will spend on the wait list can vary from a few weeks to a few months.
- Records Needed for Evaluation
 - Medical records from your child's Primary Care Provider
 - Birth records from your child's birth hospital
 - Most recent IFSP or IEP and evaluation report
 - Speech, motor, cognitive, and mental health (if applicable) evaluations or therapy notes
 - Family Services Plan, Part 2 Family History, if the child has been placed in child protective services
